### Official Information Act (1982) Request

I write in response to your Official Information Act request, dated 09 September 2019. You requested the following information:

- **A breakdown of age and ethnicity of the individuals who have had measles vaccinations at community drop-in clinics and hospital clinics since they were set up in response to measles in the area.**
- **An estimate of how many individuals in the Counties Manukau DHB are unimmunised against measles.**

In follow-up to our earlier response on 17 September, we have now completed some analysis that addresses your request and are providing this to you as previously advised.

1. **A breakdown of age and ethnicity of the individuals who have had measles vaccinations at community drop-in clinics and hospital clinics since they were set up in response to measles in the area.**

We have organised a range of 'drop in' and public clinics to enable vaccination across the Counties Manukau region since 28 August 2019. In total, these clinics vaccinated 6,336 people. These clinics were all completed by 25 September 2019, and are summarised below (**table 1**).
